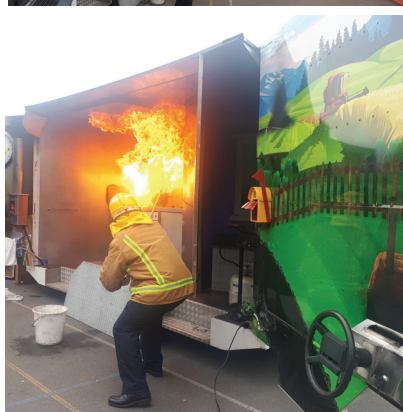

She delivered two talk sessions to our ELL students on the day. Netsafe is an independent, not for profit organization in New Zealand with a focus on online safety.

Netsafe offers information, advice and support for:

- Online bullying, abuse and harassment.
- Online scams.
- Online trading complaints.
- Revenge porn (leaked nudes)
- Staying safe online.
