

Food Environment Policy

Purpose:

- To support our community wellbeing/hauora (taha tinana, taha wairua, taha hinengaro, and taha whānau) by creating a healthier food environment.
- To ensure the food environment at our school strengthens community relationships, and reaffirms and upholds our school values and culture of celebrating diversity

To achieve these goals Te Puna Wai o Waipapa - Hagley College will:

- 1. ensure food provided through school is prepared in an environment that adheres to food safety guidelines.
- 2. work with, and regularly consult and communicate with our school community to implement this policy
- 3. affirm our community's wellbeing/ hauora, diversity (cultural and special dietary needs), and relationships, through our food environment, procedures and communications.

 eg: consistent use of karakia kai
- 4. ensure class rewards, celebrations, student prizes, fundraiser activities, school camp menus, and any other school related events provide healthy food options including allowing for special dietary requirements
- 5. ensure any food provided by or through school is affordable and sustainably grown local seasonal produce.
- 6. empower students with the knowledge to make good decisions around healthy eating through option subjects and senior hauora programmes.
- 7. enable staff members to model healthier food choices in their role as a teacher
- 8. promote and provide water as the best option for staff and students
- promote physical activity as the partner of good nutrition.
 engage with health and education services that support this policy and conversely, not
 associate with programmes or sponsors that promote foods/drinks that diminish our
 community wellbeing/ hauora.

Policy Procedures

The College Wellbeing Team will lead community consultation and the implementation of the policy:

Teaching & Learning:

- 1. Where appropriate organise professional development for all staff on the Healthy Active Learning Food and Drink Guidelines, and the school food environment policy.
- 2. Consult with staff to co-create a plan to integrate the policy into the school curriculum.

School Environment:

- 1. Work alongside the College Cafe to ensure menus comply with this policy, including culturally appropriate, sustainable and affordable food.
- 2. Create a communications plan to promote healthier, sustainable food messages.
- 3. Provide a school environment that supports healthy eating and makes water the easy drink choice; and regularly review our progress.
- 4. Support staff and students through scoping, planning, and budgeting to be able to offer non-food or nutritious alternatives for class rewards and school events, including but not limited to sports days, festivals, and fundraisers.
- 5. Support staff and students to plan and budget for nutritious food at school camps by creating easy and appropriate menus and shopping lists.
- 6. Support our community to access nutritious, affordable sustainable food, such as [breakfast club], [edible gardens], [links to local producers] and/or [other].

Marketing/Sponsorship/Activities:

1. Review current food providers, programmes, and sponsors affiliated with school to ensure current and any new affiliations, comply with our policy.
